

Coastal Community Credit Union supports radical renovation for Indigenous charity

HeroWork Victoria receives \$10,000 to help transform Indigenous Perspective Society's building into a culturally relevant space.

Vancouver Island, BC, Canada – September 27, 2021: On September 30th, Coastal Community Credit Union joins organizations across the country in observing the National Day for Truth and Reconciliation. The new federal statutory holiday provides an opportunity to recognize and reflect on the tragic legacy of residential schools. For the Credit Union, it's also a reminder of the work needed to advance reconciliation with Indigenous peoples. As a step forward on this path, Coastal Community is donating \$10,000 to HeroWork Victoria to support their renovation project with the Indigenous Perspectives Society (IPS).

"When I think of the work to create culturally inclusive reconciliatory spaces, I am reminded that the work cannot be done by Indigenous peoples alone," said Rachelle Dallaire, IPS Executive Director. "I am honoured to have Coastal Community Credit Union and HeroWork walk alongside our work."

IPS' mission is to foster a deeper understanding of Indigenous perspectives, cultural differences, and the need for self-determination. HeroWork's renovation of IPS' building will help the Society deliver their important mandate of deepening reconciliation. The transformed space will reflect Indigenous cultures, improve the workflow and increase the size of training spaces for the organization.

"When HeroWork brings a community together to do one of their radical renovations for a charity, they also build a sense of belonging," said Allyson Prescesky, Senior Manager, Community Experience and Communications for Coastal Community. "Their 2021 project to make the Indigenous Perspectives Society's location a more culturally reflective and safe space resonates with our commitment to build healthier communities for everyone. It's the kind of work we want to contribute to as we reflect on our own journey to reconciliation."
